It was your DSA dollars in past years that helped cover the cost of my own diaconal formation.


It is your DSA dollars that provide me with the resources that I need to continue to recruit and train deacons.







**Cemetery Price Increase** 

The St. Joseph Catholic Cemetery prices for a gravesite and perpetual care (a one-time fee for the perpetual maintenance of the cemetery) have not increased since 2006. At the February meeting of the Finance Council, it was agreed to increase the cost of a single grave to \$500 and the perpetual care fee to \$200, effective July 1, 2018. Until that time, graves may be purchased at the current price of \$425. It is optional to prepay the perpetual care fee (currently \$150) at the time of purchase of a grave, or to pay it at the time of burial at the then current rate.

## **Music Ministry**

#### Christ Is Risen! He Is Risen Indeed!

You don't have to come to Mass at St. Joseph many times to realize that the Catholic calendar is a little different from the calendar that guides marketing in the US. Outside the church doors, the "Christmas shopping season" starts earlier each year, but at St. Joseph, we were in Advent purple right through the morning Masses on December 24 and celebrated the liturgical season of Christmas for several weeks after. When flower and candy sales were at their annual peak on February 14, we were having ashes placed on our forehead, being reminded that we are (and will return to) dust, and challenged to turn away from sin and be faithful to the gospel.

The Easter season in the church is, again, not the same as in the culture. You may have been enjoying (or, depending on your Lenten discipline, avoiding) Cadbury cream eggs for several weeks already, but our great annual celebration of the Resurrection starts at night on Holy Saturday (this year, March 31) with the Easter Vigil. In this beautiful Mass, we hear not one but several readings from the Old Testament, telling again the great story of the history of salvation: how our God created everything from nothing; chose a people to be his own; led them out of slavery through the Red Sea to right worship and a promised land; how again and again that people—our ancestors in faith—failed to live up to their covenant with God but he did not abandon them; how he taught them to dream of a savior; how in the fullness of time, he did not withhold even his only-begotten Son, but handed him over to a painful, shameful death for our restoration; and finally, how that Son left his grave empty on the morning of the third day, defeating death forever.

At St. Joseph, you can count on Fr. Brendan reminding us of this truth throughout the liturgical season of Easter—the fifty days following Easter Sunday—with a hearty and joyful "Happy Easter!" at the start of every Mass. This echoes a greeting traditional in many parts of the world: instead of a simple "hello" or its local equivalent, Christians greet one another during this season with "Christ is risen!", and respond, "He is risen indeed!" This echoes the greeting of the angel to the women who came to anoint his body: "He is not here, for he is risen, as he said."

Another traditional text of the Easter liturgy is beautifully paraphrased by Matt Maher in a contemporary song we sing: "Christ is risen from the dead, trampling over death by death. Come awake, come awake, come and rise up from the grave." Let us join the earliest believers in understanding that nothing—not even death—can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus. Let us leave behind our past failings and rise with him. *Steve Kasperick-Postellon* 

#### **Pastoral Council Nominations**

The Parish Council is a consultative leadership body representing the entire parish. Working together with our pastor, Fr. Brendan Walsh, this Council provides critical guidance, support and vision for the pastoral activity of the parish and aids in the establishment of policies and procedures. It is important that we have a Council that is representative of the make-up of our Parish, so don't be concerned that you may not "fit the bill." All parishioners, long-timers, short-timers and new parishioners are invited and welcomed.

We are asking all parishioners to seriously reflect upon serving on our Parish Pastoral Council. Each year four members and two alternates are chosen at large to serve on the Council. The selection process for Council candidates begins the weekend of April 21/22 when nomination ballots will be distributed at each Mass. Parishioners will be asked to submit nominations – either themselves or someone else; all nominations will need to be returned by Friday, April 29. Nominees will be contacted and asked to attend an evening of discernment on May 10. Council members will share the roles and duties of the Council. Those parishioners who accept the nomination will be included in a "selection by lot" to be held at the 5pm Mass during the Vigil Mass of Pentecost on Saturday, May 19. This is a very important group that provides counsel and guidance on the critical decisions here at St. Joseph Parish. Please ask the Holy Spirit to guide and enlighten you in this very important commitment to the spiritual and pragmatic needs of St. Joseph Parish.

## Caritas Committee - Nominations for Membership

It is time to appeal to you, members of the St. Joseph Parish family, to identify candidates to serve on the Caritas Committee. The candidate could be you or someone else whom you believe would be a good steward and sensitive to the needs of those around them.

The Caritas Committee is composed of nine people as well as representatives from the Pastoral and Finance Councils and a staff liaison. Members of this committee research and recommend possible recipients, and present the Caritas Sunday appeals on their behalf. The Committee monitors the collection results and reports the amounts distributed via bulletin and *Chips and Sawdust* articles.

On the weekend of April 28/29, we are seeking nominations for individuals to serve on the Committee. Serving on Caritas is a great way to get to know people in the parish and to become more informed about the needs and services in our community. Please consider nominating yourself or someone whom you feel would be a good candidate.

All nominees will be invited to attend a meeting on Thursday, May 16, for an evening of discernment to learn more about serving on the Committee. Three new committee members will be chosen by lot to serve 3-year terms, and two individuals will be selected to serve one-year terms as alternates at the 5pm Mass on Pentecost eve, Saturday, May 19.



# NRN trip July 23-28, 2018



What is NRN? NRN, National Relief Network, is an organization out of Grand Rapids, MI that organizes volunteers to go into Federally declared disaster areas to help with relief efforts from tornado's, hurricane's, floods, etc. The work can range from debris clean up, to dismantling of homes, to repairs and rebuilds. For more information on the NRN organization visit their website at www.nrn.org.

**When is the trip**? The week of July 23-28. We travel by bus (non-stop) and will be scheduled for 3-4 days of work depending on the location and one fun day. This service trip is open to all St. Joseph Parish members and friends that are 13 years old and up (12 years old with a parent/guardian going).

Where are we going? Work orders come to the NRN either from the Red Cross or FEMA. It all depends on Mother Nature. Typically we are not given a destination until about 30 days before our trip. We usually stay in a church or school classrooms/gymnasium on air mattresses.

**Cost?** The cost is \$524 per person which includes food (while we are down there), travel, lodging and most supplies (the cost does not in-



clude fun day cost). There will be a NRN collection in May and other fundraising opportunities. Minimum is 35 people.

What do you need to do now? If you would like to attend this year's trip you will need to sign up on the sign-up sheet either in the Gathering Space in the Country Church, or at the Mustard Seed Youth Group meeting or by contacting Don at 734-426-2674. An information meeting is scheduled for **April 18 at 7pm** in the Parish Center. A \$100 deposit per person is due in order to hold your spot. An email will be sent with information regarding the second payment due on **May 23.** The week of June 3



a mailing will be sent out with details of money still owed and the paperwork. On **June 20 at 7pm** there will be a meeting in the Parish Center to cover last minute details and collect paperwork and final payments.
