

CARITASCOMMITTEE

Thank you to all our generous parishioners who supported our collection in September! We collected \$7,023.25 to send to victims of Hurricane Florence. Our donation was sent to Catholic Charities in the Diocese of Raleigh, North Carolina, which serves 54 counties over 32,000 square miles. Catholic Charities continues to work in these communities, getting needed supplies to families, distributing food and water, clean-up kits, hygiene items, diapers and baby formula. They are also helping families move into safe and stable housing. Your donation is helping to make this possible!

Our next Caritas collection will be the weekend of December 29/30. Our featured recipient will be Feed My Starving Children. Founded in 1987, this Christian non-profit organization coordinates the packaging and distribution of food to people in developing nations. It has reached out to more than 70 countries with nutritious meals specifically designed to assist in reversing and preventing undernutrition. More than 90% of total donations are spent directly on meal production. Millions of volunteers, including our own parishioners and other members of the Dexter community, have helped to package the meals. On April 6, 2019 Dexter United Methodist Church, with the support of volunteers from other churches in the community, will once again host a meal preparation day. Parishioners from St. Joseph Parish will have the opportunity to sign up for this in early 2019.

Our Caritas collection will be used to fulfill the balance of our commitment to this project, and the remainder of our collection will be shared with our ongoing recipients.

Thank you for your prayerful consideration and your compassion and generosity as we share our treasure and talents with those in most need.


BUILDING the BROTHERHOOD OF CHRIST

We again want to extend our heartfelt gratitude and give thanks to our fellow parishioners not only for their time and talent at the garden and making deliveries but also for the donations of cash, return slips and returnables during our annual drive. A special thank you goes to Dexter Mill who donated some of our plants and seeds. Thanks to all of you who shared funds for our garden necessities, tools, mulch, soil amendments and maintenance items so that we continue have fertile and improved soil structure to maximize our garden growth and production.

Your participation in our ministry is particularly helpful as more hands make for lighter work. The Giving Garden is part of the Charitable Activities and Social Justice Commission whose mission is: "Confident that the Spirit of God abides with us, we aim to follow Jesus' mandate that we be salt for our communities in family, work and citizenship. We strive to inform and offer the challenge of living in justice and charity. Particularly, we aim to be in solidarity with those on the margins of our society." Basically, at the Giving Garden, members plant, cultivate and harvest vegetables and herbs to help feed the hungry and those in need who struggle for fresh produce. Volunteers work as their schedules allow - as little as once a season and as much as every week of a season. Even committing to join us for one or two seasons helps!

We urge you to think about joining us in 2019. You can mark your calendars now to join us next year for our spring kick-off meeting at 7 PM on April 16, 2019 in the Parish Center. Week 4, Love


