

Here are two opportunities for anyone who would like to be part of the work of the music ministry, but can't commit to regular weekly rehearsals.



PALM SUNDAY PASSION DRAMATIZATION 2018

It's time to start practicing for our annual Passion Dramatization! Rehearsals for the Palm Sunday dramatization will begin Sunday, February 18, 2018 at 12:30 pm at the Country Church. Paula Dumont will continue to help organize the dramatization of the Passion of our Lord.

We need everyone's participation to make this year *extra* special and there are several ways that you and your family can help:

- 1. Assistant director or helper (adult) willing to help shepherd this great group of youth and to help hand out/ collect ribbons at one or more of the Palm Sunday liturgies.
- "Actors" (ages 6th grade through adult) Roles in the Passion Play consist of crowd people, soldiers, 2. Pharisees, Weeping Women, Pontius Pilate, Simon of Cyrene, the Blessed Mother and, of course, Jesus. The actors mime the passion as its read aloud by a narrator. For the larger roles like Jesus and Pilate, we draw the name of those willing to take the part by lot, letting the Holy Spirit chose the right person. (Jesus does have to be a person tall enough to fit on the cross). ** TIME COMMITMENT: At least 3 of the 5 rehearsals and participation in the three liturgies Palm Sunday weekend (March 24-25)
- 3. "Narrators" (one reader for each of the 3 liturgies) The reader narrates the passion as the actors mime the story. Please talk to Father Brendan if you are interested.**TIME COMMITMENT: 1 or 2 rehearsals and one liturgy Palm Sunday weekend.
- 4. "Ribbon Wavers" (ages Preschool through adult) We need people to welcome Jesus into Jerusalem waving ribbons! This is a wonderful opportunity for families with children who want to participate, but aren't old enough yet to take on an "actor" role or for anyone who wants to be part of this incredible experience. Just simply sign up to participate during your normal liturgy time. Come about 15 minutes before your Mass on Palm Sunday weekend, get your ribbons and instructions and sit where you usually sit. **TIME COMMITMENT: 15 minutes before your usual Mass time on Palm Sunday weekend, 5 minutes during the Dramatization.
