





CARITAS COMMITTEE

Mission Appeal

The weekend of August 25/26 Fr. Jevic will be here from the Diocese of Romblon in the Philippines for our annual Mission Appeal. This area lies in the Pacific Rim and is hit more frequently than other provinces by tropical typhoons. In 2013 the area was devastated by Typhoon Haiyan (locally known as Super Typhoon Yolanda), the strongest tropical cyclone on record. Floods destroyed not only the crops, but rendered the fields covered with infertile soil from the mountains. Until now only portions of the fields have been cleared. The planting areas have been reduced to more than three quarters of the original size. Children in the area have not been able to return to their Religious Education due to the need to help their families recover their losses.

Please prayerfully consider helping Fr. Jevic and the Diocese of Romblon care for their flock this summer during our Mission Appeal.

Music Ministry

What happens at a church choir rehearsal?

If you've never sung in a choir before, your idea of the word "rehearsal" may be formed primarily by your experience of a rehearsal for a special sacramental event, such as a wedding rehearsal or a rehearsal for your First Communion Mass. In many parishes, rehearsals for such events are largely about timing and choreography: who goes where, when, to do what. Often, such a rehearsal involves one well-informed person giving directions, and many people listening and absorbing these directions. While this model can be effective for such rehearsals, it's not at all what choir rehearsals look like on a week-to-week basis.

A familiar model that choir rehearsals resemble more closely is a practice for a team sport. Like a sports practice, choir rehearsals usually begin with some kind of warm-up drills. This can involve both vocalizing and various physical exercises --and in a church choir, it also involves prayer. As the late famous children's choir director Helen Kemp was fond of saying, "Body, mind, spirit, voice: it takes the *whole person* to sing and rejoice!" After the warm-ups, we sing music that will be used at Mass in the coming weeks. Just as a sports team will sometimes have a scrimmage (actually playing a proper but informal game of volleyball, soccer, etc.), sometimes we will sing some pieces of music all the way through, perhaps even in the order they'll be sung at Mass. More often, though, choir rehearsals involve focused work on sections of songs. You might compare this to running wind sprints or practicing free throw shots: it may not be as enjoyable as actually playing a game (or singing a song in its entirety), but discipline helps develop specific skills that are then applied in a variety of contexts.

Like a sports team, a choir has members with various levels of skill. At any given moment, some members may take a more challenging or prominent role than others. Recall St. Paul's description of us as many parts that form the one Body of Christ: "God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended. The eye cannot say to the hand, 'I do not need you.' If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy" (1 Corinthians 12:18-26).

The US Catholic Bishops describe the generally unrehearsed community singing of the congregation as the "primary song of the Liturgy,". When we sing from the pews, we make Christ present, just as surely as he is present in the priest, the Word proclaimed, and the Eucharist. Choirs, on the other hand, "comprise persons drawn from the community who possess the requisite musical skills and a commitment to the established schedule of rehearsals and Liturgies," who for this reason "are able to enrich the celebration by adding musical elements beyond the capabilities of the congregation alone." 

Easter Vigil 2017—Welcome New Catholics

St. Joseph Parish NRN Trip July 23-28, 2018

What is NRN? NRN, National Relief Network, is an organization out of Grand Rapids, MI that organizes volunteers to go into federally declared disaster areas to help with relief efforts from tornados, hurricanes, floods, etc. The work can range from debris clean up, to dismantling of homes, to repairs and rebuilds. For more information on the NRN organization visit their website at www.nrn.org.

When is the trip? The week of July 23-28. We travel by bus (non-stop) and will be scheduled for 3-4 days of work depending on the location and one fun day. This service trip is open to all St. Joseph Parish members and friends that are 13 years old and up (12 years old with a parent/guardian going). Minimum for the trip is 35 people.

Where are we going? Work orders come to the NRN either from the Red Cross or FEMA. It all depends on Mother Nature. Typically we are not given a destination until 30 days before our trip. We usually stay in church/school classrooms/gymnasium on air mattresses.

Cost? The cost is \$524 per person which includes food (while we are there), travel, lodging and most supplies (the cost does not include fun day cost). To help reduce the cost, on June 9 and 10 youth will speak at Mass and serve pizza & pop and coffee & donuts. Your generous contributions will help reduce the cost of the trip.

What to do now? If you would like to attend this year's trip contact Don at 734-426-2674. On June 20 at 7pm there will be a meeting in the Parish Center to address final details. At this time final payments and medical release and parent permission forms are due.




