

Lent is Upon Us

It seems like only yesterday we were preparing for Easter and then told to stay home, wear a mask, and stay apart. Nearly a year later, after learning to live differently, we return to the sacred time of Lent. Ash Wednesday is February 17, 2021. Let us remember Lent is a time when we strive to live differently. It is a time to go without, to reach out in service, to make intentional sacrifices. It is a time to offer extra prayers: seeking guidance, and in gratitude. To make this time of prayer, fasting and, almsgiving meaningful we will offer the following:

- † We will offer Black Books for daily prayer.
- † We will offer Stations of the Cross on Friday nights.
- † We will offer extra times for Confession on Saturdays during Lent from 3:30-4:30pm.
- † An evening of individual Confessions with extra priests on March 23 at 7:00 pm in the Country Church.

Lenten Activities

Our Lenten theme of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving will continue to lead us through these sacred 40 days.

- † Daily Mass, weekly Stations of the Cross, weekend Mass, private prayer with the Little Black Books, daily and Saturday evening Rosary before and after daily Mass Monday through Friday, weekly Reconciliation, and Anointing of the Sick.
- † Lenten Food Collection for Catholic Social Services, a long time practice of feeding the hungry will continue. We will bring our gifts and place them at the feet of St. Joseph or leave them in the Village Church entrance way.
- † A personal Lenten discipline of fasting, going without, is a good practice to pray on and discern.
- † Lenten Parish Mission with Teresa Tomeo, March 14, 15 & 16.

PASTORAL COUNCIL UPDATE



The year of 2020 taught us many new things including new phrases. Phrases that I recall clearly: These challenging times, Unprecedented times, Epidemic, Pandemic, Lockdown, Covid-19, Covid Crisis, Contact Tracing, Flattening the curve, Patient Zero, Personal Protection Equipment, Asymptomatic, Quarantine, Symptomatic, Ventilator. Many of these words and phrases have negative associations.

The Covid-19 pandemic has certainly impacted the way we interact with others. We have had to slow down and cut back on all of the things that we do face-to-face to help slow the spread of the virus. I recall hearing the phrase "Absence makes that heart grow fonder" but only had glimpses of what that really means until I had to give up so much because of the Covid pandemic. No more sports, no social gatherings, no dining out, no visiting loved ones, no travel, no going to the office, no going to school, and no going to Mass. I would like to suggest that we look for positive words and phrases to recall the blessings of 2020. Some positive phrases that come to mind are; Building, Caring, Coping, Cherished, Distance Learning, Perseverance, Protecting, Serving, Sharing, Telecommute, YouTube Mass, Volunteer, Zoom.

Instead of focusing on the negative, we have chosen to take the opportunity to tackle the things that we have been putting off for numerous reasons, but most commonly because we were too busy or did not have enough time. We tried many new things in the Zettel household. In 2020 we suddenly had more time available than ever before due to limited or no group activities, travel and other restrictions put in place to flatten the curve. Looking back, we did a lot!

We have learned to become the hands of Christ by offering what we have and accepting what others offer with gratitude. We are more intentional about planning our interactions with others to have meaning and impact. We find ourselves longing for the friendship and support of those we cannot be with. We miss our parish family, but we enjoy each interaction we have when we are able to see them at Mass. We smile bigger when we see our families and friends. We feel joy more than ever before. Keeping Sunday Holy at Church and at Home

The music ministry exists to help all who worship at St. Joseph to grow as disciples of Christ, especially through music.

At the time this newsletter goes to press, the bishop of our Diocese of Lansing has dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and other Holy Days of Obligation until February 16 (just before Lent begins). This dispensation has been in place for nearly a year now, and may even be extended further (see dioceseoflansing.org for updates).

If you are considering your first return to Mass since last March, know that you are most welcome! We limit attendance at Masses at the Country Church to 250 people, leaving plenty of room to maintain safe distance between households. Out of consideration for one another's safety and peace of mind, we wear masks, and hand sanitizer is available. We use disposable worship aid booklets instead of hymnals and minimize physical contact with one another. You might also try a weekday Mass at the Village Church; the smaller congregation at these Masses means a lower risk of viral transmission. We can't completely eliminate risk, but we are all working to make worshiping together at St. Joseph as safe as possible.

Even if you're not coming back to Mass yet (or if you're unable to come any particular weekend), know that we are praying with and for you. We are still joined as members of Christ's Body, and you are present with us in a real way. Continue to keep Sunday holy wherever you are. Watch and pray the Mass with us (a video is posted on YouTube at stjos.com each weekend; there will be one for Ash Wednesday, too). Rest from unnecessary work, and take some quiet time with God. A resource I've found surprisingly helpful is the many perpetual adoration chapels around the world that livestream on YouTube; like having a crucifix or icon, it provides a visual focus for my prayer time.

independent living and interpersonal skills, attend school, go to work and enjoy social and recreational programs. This "special place" helps families provide their children with services often not readily available. They develop and share the gifts God gave them! They develop relationships, and are able to share their abilities and are able to help others. Each of them is helped to appreciate their dignity and worth as they grow in self esteem. The Guanellian charism of Family Spirit helps them enjoy their St. Louis family, those at school and work, and their own families.

St. Louis Center is doing God's work for 70 individuals and families every day. It costs \$245 per day to care for a resident. The K of C match will take every day's support we raise and double it. 
