Dear St Joseph Parishioners,

"To grow as "the people of God" (church) we need a campus that fully supports every aspect of the communal, faith-filled life that we are called to as disciples of Jesus Christ." - Our Stairway Vision



The world defines a "church" as "a building for public Christian worship." But that is not how Catholics define "church." We define it as the coming together of the people of God. Whenever we come together, whether it is at Mass, at the Festival, for a bible study or at coffee and donuts, we are "church." Jesus told us, "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." He did not limit such gatherings to Mass.

We are blessed to have a beautiful and functional space in which to come together and share the sacraments. We call it the Country Church. That building fully supports our being a warm and welcoming community. But being a warm and welcoming community should not be limited to an hour on the weekend.

That is why this capital campaign **"Together in Faith & Fellowship"** is so critical. With the exception of the village church, all the other village buildings that we use to support our mission as "church" are not handicap-accessible.

- They are quickly losing their ability to provide a safe, comfortable, and adequate environment to gather as "the people of God."
- They are quickly losing their ability to allow us to gather as "church" in all those other ways that we need to gather to grow in our knowledge and love of God.
- They are quickly becoming an obstacle to easily invite and care for those in need.

The time has come to finish what we started in 2003. We began with a vision of a unified campus. We need a campus that not only provides space to share in the sacraments but space to support the education, fellowship, and administration necessary to allow us to continue to be the vibrant and growing Catholic church which has touched the lives of hundreds of thousands of Catholics and non-Catholics the last 181 years.

This past spring, members of the parish Finance Council and Stairway Committee and other parish leadership met to refine our vision for a united campus. In May, we presented our vision to the Diocese of Lansing Loan and Investment Committee. In June, the Diocese of Lansing Finance Council recommended we hold a fall campaign to secure gifts and pledges to raise necessary funds. This will allow us to design and build a hall, kitchen, classrooms, and offices to move us toward a unified campus.

This FACT sheet provides important information about this effort. At each Mass on the weekend of September 18/19 we will have brief presentations about our **Together in Faith & Fellowship** campaign, including details of our facility plans and a call to prayer by our faith family for the success of this effort. We will also have information at our parish picnic on September 11/12. We are excited to share the plans and answer any questions you may have.

If you are unable to attend the weekend of September 18/19, informational presentations will again be available following the 5p Mass on October 2 and 11a Mass on October 17.

As we start our **Together in Faith & Fellowship** campaign, every household is asked to reflect prayerfully upon your blessings and ask yourself how you are using them to glorify God. We need each of you to help our parish.

PARISH HISTORY 1840-2021



Founded in 1840 when eight Irish Catholic families gathered to celebrate Mass on January 1, 1840. St. Joseph Parish has been a vibrant, active part of the Dexter community for more than 175 years.

FIRST CHURCH-1840

- Mission Church for Irish immigrants
- Small frame building corner of Dexter Townhall and Quigley Roads
- Destroyed by fire in 1854

SECOND CHURCH

- Framed Church (temporary) on the corner of 4th & Dover in Village of Dexter.
- This church was dismantled when 3rd church was dedicated.

THIRD CHURCH — 1872

- Brick Gothic architecture with 180 ft. steeple
- Still used for daily Mass, weddings and funerals
- Seats 350
- Rectory built in 1904
- Parish school established in 1920
- New brick school built in 1925. School closed in 1968. Converted to parish center in the 1980's.
- Convent built in 1952. Converted to parish offices in 1980's. Second floor offices reconfigured twice between 2000-2010.

FOURTH CHURCH — 2008

- Country Church
- Seats 750
- Expandable to 900 seats
- Move walls to expand seating to 1,000

2021— Currently have 2 campuses

- Village Church at the corner of 4th & Dover. Parish center, parish office and rectory on village campus.
- Country Church sits on 46 acres at the corner of Mast & North Territorial Roads

A CHRONOLOGY OF OUR STAIRWAY PLANNING TO DATE

- **2000:** More than 300 parishioners participated in VOICES (Vocalizing Opportunities, Issues, Challenges & Envisioning Strategies) sessions, initiated by Diocese of Lansing, and identified three needs: respond to continued growth of area; strengthen and improve Faith Formation for all; invite fallen away Catholics and non-Catholics.
- **2001:** Identified and researched current and projected parish growth. Recommended purchasing land and moving to a new site.
- Fall 2001: Four town hall meetings held to inform parishioners and seek input.
- April 2002: Purchased 46 acres of land at the SW corner of North Territorial & Mast Roads in Webster Township.
- **May 2002:** Convened a group of parishioners, our "Stairway Committee," to begin studying *Built of Living Stones*, a document which gives guidance and direction on building new churches.
- **September 2002:** Received permission from the Diocese to initiate a capital campaign.
- August & September 2003: Adopted a phased approach: Phase I the church; Phase II office space, faith formation classrooms, meeting spaces and a parish hall.
- August & September 2003: A total of 440 parishioners participated in eight focus group sessions to educate and inform and to gauge potential support for the plan.
- Fall 2003 Spring 2006: The "Stairway to the Future" capital campaign, raised over \$3.34 million in gifts and pledges.
- March 2005: Held ceremonial groundbreaking on Feast of St. Joseph.
- December 2005: Began Called to the Next Step capital campaign. Raised \$1.65 million in pledges and gifts.
- August 2006: Actually broke ground and began construction.
- March 15, 2008: Dedicated new church building on the Feast of St. Joseph, (Saturday of Palm Sunday weekend.)
- Fall 2009: Began Step Up in Faith capital stewardship campaign. Raised over \$2.23 million in commitments.
- Fall 2012: Continuing the Journey campaign raised \$1.97 million in gifts and pledges.
- July 2002 March 2021: Received Memorial Fund donations of \$1.67 million and miscellaneous Building Fund donations totaling \$483,171.
- February 2003 Sept 2020: Annual Festivals raised \$1.3 million.
- August 2006-June 2018: Annual Silent Auction Fundraisers have raised \$206,818.
- October 2015: Made final loan payment to the Diocese of Lansing. Loan paid off in year 7 of a 15 year note.
