Phase II Plans

Our next step (during the month of March) has been to begin the process of completing formal drawings which will go out for bidding. We have contacted several construction companies who we will interview and ask to bid the project. Our preliminary reductions and estimates have reduced our projected cost to \$8.95 million. Going forward, we will make decisions on general contractors or construction management. We will work on approvals with Webster Township. We will work on final approvals with the Diocese of Lansing to secure a final construction cost. Then we will break ground. Along the way decisions on wall color, carpets, tile, kitchen appliances, and cabinets will be made.

The Current Drawings

The floor plan (on the following page) is different from the large plan on the wall in the gathering space.

- † The office and faith formation wings were reduced by four feet.
- † The teen space was reduced by eight feet.
- † The social hall was reduced by nine feet which eliminated 5 tables but will still seat up to 384 people.
- † Doors in the office were moved and a door was added to the kitchen in the social hall.
- † Total footage reduced by 2,000 square feet.

Cost Reductions

- † Owners' contingency was reduced to 8% from 10%.
- † Architectural and Engineering fees reduced by \$100,000.
- † Furnishing allowance was reduced by \$30,000.
- † Phone and data allowance was reduced by \$15,000.

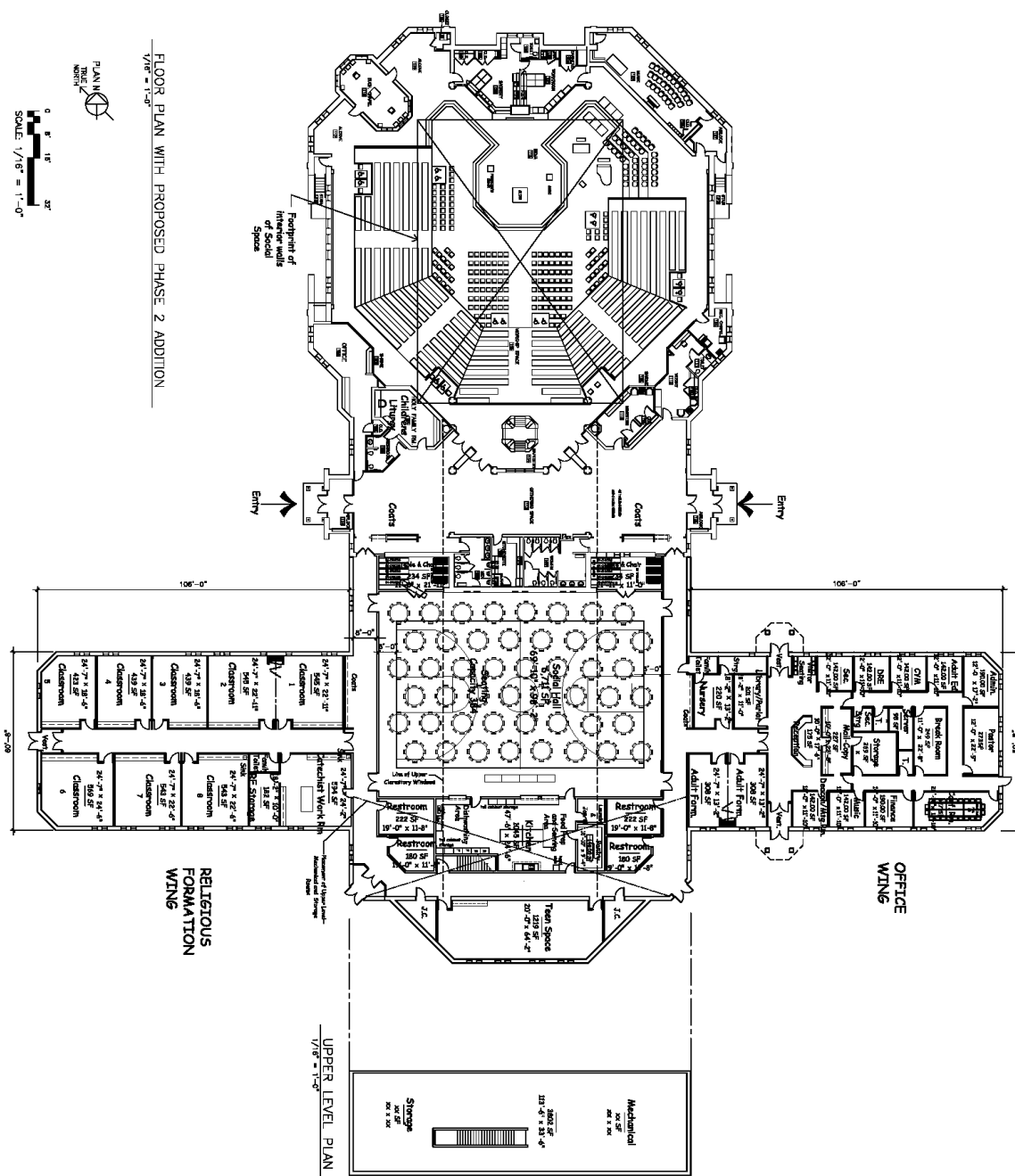

PASTORAL COUNCIL UPDATE

With Lent in full swing, and Easter on the horizon, it's a good time to remember Jesus' call to us to have a servant's heart. Luckily, there is a plethora of opportunities in our Parish Community!

We continue our Lenten Collections. The schedule can be found in the weekly bulletin and email. And we are still collecting cases of water for Flint.

Our Parish Festival is always looking for volunteers. This is a two-day summer parish celebration held on the grounds of the Country Church open to the public. The Festival is a highlight of our parish life with many ways to participate.

There is the Spring Grounds Clean-Up and Cemetery Clean-Up. Many hands make light work, and who doesn't like a donut?

Lastly, as the Easter Season winds down, we look to the Holy Spirit for guidance as we begin the annual process of electing Pastoral Council members. Our next Caritas collection will be the weekend of May 28-29.

Feed My Starving Children is the recipient of the May Caritas collection. Founded in 1987, this Christian non-profit organization coordinates the packaging and distribution of food to people in developing nations. It has reached out to more than 70 countries with nutritious meals specifically designed to assist in reversing and preventing undernutrition. More than 90% of total donations are spent directly on meal production.

As a parish, we have committed \$6,000 in support of Dexter United Methodist's 2022 FMSC meal preparation drive. In turn, we will be able to send 120 volunteers to participate.

As of March 1, we have committed \$1,450 to our parish commitment. The balance of our commitment will be fulfilled with the May Caritas collection. The remainder of our collection will be shared with our ongoing recipients.

Thank you for your prayerful consideration and your compassion and generosity as we share our treasure and talents with those in most need.

Psalm 31: The Passion Then and Now

The music ministry exists to help all who worship at St. Joseph grow as disciples of Christ, especially through music.

As the Russian invasion began several weeks ago, the religious leaders of Ukraine invited all to join in praying Psalm 31. We know this best as the responsorial psalm from the Good Friday Liturgy of the Lord's Passion. At that liturgy, we use as a refrain Jesus's cry from the cross in St. Luke's account of the passion: "Into your hands I commend my spirit." The psalmist addresses these words to God as "Lord," but Jesus alters the text to address "Father." Even in his agony, Jesus calls out in trust to the one he knows as Abba. The psalmist speaks in metaphors, calling God refuge, fortress, fortified city, and two different words for rock. The psalmist also calls on God to do many things, expecting God to deliver, listen, hurry, rescue, save, lead, guide, free, redeem—and all that is just in the first stanza! The prayer comes out of a situation of terrible distress. Enemies lie in wait. Sickness and sorrow wear on the body. Friend and enemy alike avoid the afflicted one. Trust in God is the only support for this miserable person.

Christ's suffering is our suffering. On the cross he bore all our burdens. Take some time this Holy Week to pray Psalm 31 for your own need, and in solidarity with Jesus and with all who suffer still.

One last invitation: the major liturgies of the Triduum are not to be missed! Mass on Holy Thursday at 7 pm, the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday at 7 pm, the Easter Vigil on Saturday at 8 pm, and the three Easter Sunday Masses at 8 am, 10 am, and 12 noon. Each of these liturgies enhances our understanding of the others and of the complete story of Jesus's incarnation, life, passion, death, and resurrection. If you've never been to one or more of these liturgies, you owe it to yourself to experience them. Hope to see you there!
