Proverbs 11 verse 25: Generous persons will prosper; those who refresh others will themselves be refreshed. Our next Caritas collection will be the weekend of July 30-31.

Angel's Outreach Ministries is the recipient of the July Caritas Collection. This ministry was started in 1987 by Deacon Anthony Verdun, and his wife Susan. It is run by them and other volunteers at St John Vianney Parish in Flint Michigan. Their Mission is to lower gang activity by providing positive role models to the children, keeping them off the streets, raising self-esteem and helping strengthen vulnerable families. They provide a safe place for the children and teens of Flint to go while keeping them off the streets.

The Ministry provides education, socialization, fun and games. They have started gathering again following the COVID restrictions. Prior to COVID they met 3 Saturdays a month in addition to 3 or 4 field trips a year. Their biggest events have been Christmas and Easter parties which include clothing and gifts being passed out. Additionally, coats and socks are provided for children who come without them in cold weather.

Angel's Outreach Ministry is funded by donations, with all donations going directly to serving the children.

A Body of Broken Bones

The music ministry exists to help all who worship at St. Joseph grow as disciples of Christ, especially through music.

As this issue of Chips & Sawdust goes to press, I'm putting the finishing touches on a prayer service that will serve as the "capstone ritual event," one of the final requirements toward my completion of my master's degree in music and liturgy from Alverno College in Milwaukee. In August, I'll become the first graduate of this new program. It's been a long road, and I'm excited! The prayer service offers readings and music to help us reflect on one of the great truths St. Paul teaches in the New Testament: when we eat and drink the Eucharistic banquet at Mass, we not only *receive* the Body and Blood of Christ, we *participate in* Christ's Body and Blood. As Pope St. Leo the Great put it, "The effect of our sharing in the Body and Blood of Christ is to change us into what we receive."

We receive no guarantee that life as a member of Christ's Body will be easy. One of the readings from the prayer service is from the book *New Seeds of Contemplation* by Thomas Merton (1915-1968), an American Trappist monk. He wrote, "As long as we are on earth, the love that unites us will bring us suffering by our very contact with one another, because this **love is the resetting of a Body of broken bones**. Even saints cannot live with saints on this earth without some anguish, without some pain at the differences that come between them. There are two things that people can do about the pain of disunion with other people: they can love, or they can hate. Hatred recoils from the sacrifice and the sorrow that are the price of this resetting of bones. It refuses the pain of reunion. It identifies the agony with other people whose presence causes us agony by reminding us of our disunion. Hatred tries to cure disunion by annihilating those who are not united with us. It seeks peace by the elimination of everybody else but ourselves. But love, by its acceptance of the pain of reunion, begins to heal all wounds."

Let us pray for the grace to accept the pain of the differences that come between us. Let us accept the care of Jesus, the Great Physician, as he sets our broken bones, and his love begins to heal our wounds.

She has a certificate in Theological Studies from Sienna Heights University, awarded in 2019. She also holds a Certificate of Graduation from the Institute of Spiritual Direction in 2020. She holds a Bachelor of Science in Environmental Soil Science from Michigan State University. Mel is the mother of an 18 year old son, who was diagnosed at the age of 6 with Level 1 Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)/ADHD, and Sensory-Processing Disorder (SPD). She now serves as a Special Needs Catechesis resource and Spiritual Director out of the St. Joseph (Dexter), and supports alumni resource groups with the Institute of Spiritual Direction in DeWitt.

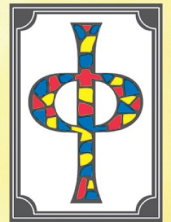
