

## A Time of Spiritual Renewal

Each year we as a Catholic community are called to use the 40 day of Lent as a time of spiritual renewal. The words of Jesus in scripture call us to **PRAY**, to **FAST**, to **GIVE ALMS**. This means in an intentional way we are invited and reminded to spend extra time in **PRAYER**. We get up early and sit in quiet. We take walks and talk to God. We add an extra daily Mass in our schedule to listen to and to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. We find a quiet place in our home to sit and read scripture or other spiritual readings to see God's grace and guidance. We seek the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We consider way to **FAST**, to **GO WITHOUT**, to skip dessert, no extra chocolate, no sweets, no drive thru coffees, no meat on Fridays. To go without is a way to sacrifice and to discipline ourselves. It is a way to practice keeping our minds in charge over the hunger of the body. To **GIVE ALMS** is an opportunity for us to share our financial resources to help those in most in need. To give in service, to give in sacrifice. To give gratitude for our blessings. To give with the awareness that sharing is a way to show love, to show compassion, to show care and concern for others who suffer.

Lent is a time of prayer, fasting, and giving. As we look to another 40 days to grow in holiness and grace. Let us use these days well to grow in faith.

## **Notes from Pastoral Council**



As Lent draws near, the observance of Easter in anticipation of Ascension and Pentecost is upon us. As Catholics it is a time when we ready ourselves through the foundational act of our religion; prayer, fasting and giving. These acts of penance change us in relation to ourselves, change us in our relationship with God and change us in our relationship with others.

The Church professes this mystery of prayer in the Apostles' Creed and celebrates it in the participation of the faithful in the word of God in the sacramental liturgy, so that the life of the faithful may be conformed to Christ in the Holy Spirit to the glory of God the Father. This mystery requires that the faithful believe in it, that they celebrate it, and that they live

from it in a vital and personal relationship with the living and true God.


Practicing fasting and abstinence ensures the times of ascesis and penance fully prepare us for the liturgical feasts and help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart.

Works of charitable acts by which we come to the aid of others, be it a family member, a neighbor, a person in our community or those far from our community that we do not know. Listening, consoling, comforting are works of mercy, as are empathy and bearing wrongs patiently. Acts of giving that address the physical and material necessities of others are of the highest importance. Take care to see that the hungry are fed, the homeless have shelter, naked are clothed, and sick and imprisoned are not alone.

The Season of Lent is a particularly appropriate time for spiritual exercises, penitential liturgies, voluntary self-denial such as fasting and almsgiving, and fraternal sharing (charitable and missionary works).

As Apostle Paul wrote in Galatians 6:9; And let us not grow weary in well-doing, for in due season we shall reap, if we do not lose heart. So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all, and especially to those who are of the household of faith.

As past generations in Dexter committed in 1840 to build St. Joseph church to create a family that gathers to foster the spiritual fellowship, so to have those today accepted the opportunity to commit to building for the future Dexter's Saint Joseph Church family. Saint Paul speaks to us of a *kairós*, as an opportune and decisive moment for sowing goodness in view of a future harvest. Pope Francis speaks to us in his words, "What is this "opportune time" for us? Lent is certainly such an opportune time, but so is our entire existence, of which Lent is in some way an image.
