Pastoral Council Nominations

The Pastoral Council is a consultative leadership body representing the entire parish. Working together with our pastor, Fr. Brendan Walsh, this Council provides critical guidance, support and vision for the pastoral activity of the parish and aids in the establishment of policies and procedures. It is important that we have a Council that is representative of the make-up of our Parish. All parishioners, long-timers, short-timers and new parishioners are welcomed as nominees.

We are asking all parishioners to seriously reflect upon serving on our Parish Pastoral Council. This year four members will be selected to serve for three years, one member to serve one year, and two alternates will be chosen to serve on the Council if needed. The selection process for Council candidates begins the weekend of **May 6/7** when nomination ballots will be distributed at each Mass. Parishioners will be asked to submit nominations – either themselves or someone else.

Nominees will be contacted and asked to attend an evening of discernment on **Thursday**, **May 18**. Council members will share the roles and duties of the Council. Those parishioners who accept the nomination will be included in a "selection by lot" to be held at the 5pm Mass during the Vigil Mass of Pentecost on **Saturday**, **May 27**.

This is a very important group that provides counsel and guidance on the critical decisions here at St. Joseph Parish. Please ask the Holy Spirit to guide and enlighten you in this very important commitment to the spiritual and pragmatic needs of St. Joseph Parish.

Caritas Committee - Nominations for Membership

It is time to appeal to you, members of the St. Joseph Parish family, to identify candidates to serve on the Caritas Committee. The candidate could be you or someone else whom you believe would be a good steward and sensitive to the needs of those around them.

The Caritas Committee is composed of nine people as well as representatives from the Pastoral and Finance Councils and a staff liaison. Members of this committee research and recommend possible recipients, and present the Caritas Sunday appeals on their behalf. The Committee monitors the collection results and reports the amounts distributed via bulletin and *Chips and Sawdust* articles.

On the weekend of **April 29/30**, we are seeking nominations for individuals to serve on the Committee. Serving on Caritas is a great way to get to know people in the parish and to become more informed about the needs and services in our community. Please consider nominating yourself or someone whom you feel would be a good candidate.

All nominees will be invited to attend a meeting on **Wednesday**, **May 11**, for an evening of discernment to learn more about serving on the Committee. Three new committee members will be chosen by lot to serve 3-year terms, and two individuals will be selected to serve one-year terms as alternates. at the 5pm Mass on Pentecost eve, **Saturday**, **May 27**.

PARISH CEMETERTY UPDATE

Having received expressions of concern over the last few years about how the parish cemetery on Baker Road looks with fast growing grass in the spring, we have established a cemetery committee to address the following issues:

- 1. On going lawn mowing.
- 2. Cost of graves in relation to those at neighboring cemeteries.
- 3. Cemetery regulations will be reviewed and updated.

The decisions the commission made with approval and support of the Finance Council are as follows:

- Grave Cost Increase
 - From \$500 to \$700 effective Pentecost Sunday, May 28, 2023
- Perpetual Care
 - From \$200 to \$300 effective Pentecost Sunday, Mary 28, 2023
- Lawn Mowing Contract
 - This summer we hired A2Zmowing service to care for our mowing needs at the cemetery. This **\$13,600** cost will be raised in these ways:
 - Increase the cost of graves.
 - A second envelope for cemetery maintenance in your May packet of envelopes.
 - A line item in next year's budget which will mean a significant increase to the weekly Sunday goal.

These changes to the care and maintenance of our cemetery will help us honor and care for our faithful departed. It will help us better care for the sacred grounds of our parish cemetery for years to come. Habitat Catholic Build 2023

"... just as you did it to one of the least of these members of our family, you did it unto Me." (Matthew 25:50)

The Caritas Committee would like to thank you for your generous donations for Medical Mobile Unit. They received \$2,056.20. Because of your generosity we were also able to donate to our regular recipients: Dexter Family Services, St. Joseph Parish Service Fund, Habitat For Humanity, Catholic Social Services Food Pantry, and St. Luke N.E.W. Life Center.

Every other year, the Catholic parishes in Washtenaw County help support the refurbishment of a Habitat for Humanity home for a deserving family. Habitat for Humanity of Huron Valley engages our neighbors to build better neighborhoods through our volunteer, donation, partnership and ReStore efforts. Each year, we build/renovate more than 6 homes for Washtenaw County families of low-income in need of decent, safe and affordable housing, provide more than 650 families with critical home improvement projects and engage with 1,200 residents and community partners to empower residents to revive neighborhoods and enhance their quality of life. Habitat for Humanity homes ARE NOT "FREE." Applicants must have the ability to pay a nominal down payment and take offered courses in home ownership, budget management and home repair. Each adult must also volunteer at least 250 hours helping on one of the Habitat for Humanity homes (theirs or someone else's). They are granted a low interest mortgage which they repay. That money can then be used to help finance someone else's home. The homes are updated with energy savings and safety as top priorities.

This year, Habitat seeks financial support and volunteerism to help support the Catholic Build project. Like the rest of the world, the last few years have presented challenges for Habitat for Humanity of Huron Valley. Habitat has experienced a large loss of unrestricted revenue, challenges with accessing public funding and significantly increased expenses for our programs. The buying power of Habitat homeowners has not increased while the cost of the homes has increased dramatically. Habitat now provides additional down payment assistance to make up the gap to keep our homes affordable. The support of the Catholic Build partners is critical as Habitat continues to provide affordable home ownership. St. Joseph Parish has pledged \$5,000.00 to this project. All of the Caritas collection on April 29/30 will go to this pledge.

Habitat also seeks volunteers to help with renovations at the Catholic Build on Saturday, April 15 and April 22, 9 AM - 4 PM. No construction experience is necessary, all that's needed is your willingness to learn and to help in those ways which your physical stamina allows – and your desire to work with others to provide a home for a Habitat partner family.

Caberfae Peaks is a downhill ski area located in the Lower Peninsula of Michigan near Cadillac. It gets its name from the Gaelic word for "stag's head". Caberfae Peaks' official opening was in January 1938, making it one of the oldest ski resorts in the US. The resort opened with a lodge built by the Civilian Conservation Corps and one ski trail named "Number One". The troop checked into the Eagle Village Lodge on Saturday and spent the day sledding and had a campfire that evening. On Sunday they were at Caberfae Peaks (about 45 min away) all day where they enjoyed the snow covered slopes. The Troops' next service project will be

working at the Parish Spaghetti Dinner. The Scouts will be involved with the cooking (credit for the cooking merit badge) serving the dinner and cleanup. Coupled with this, the troop will have an overnight at the Disciple House. The purpose of the overnight will be to engage in a gear shakedown for spring/summer trips. 

We are about to launch a dedicated focus on a workforce development track to focus on the trades. Those who have spent their lives in a specific trade are offering their time to train our participants in whatever trade seems to draw their attention. These partnerships help us to stretch our participants and move them in a direction that will provide for them and their family and grow the needed work force.

Our class participation of both women and men is growing. Our graduations are small in number because we graduate the women and men when they have fulfilled all the graduation requirements: sixteen classes, budget class, computer skills achieved, sixty to ninety days of paid on the job training here at the Center in one of our four businesses, continue to pass drug tests, progressing on their life plan, GED if needed, picture ID, SS Card and birth certificate in hand. During their time here in Paid on the Job Training, we are able to get to know each individual and evaluate their work ethic.

In the past fiscal year, we helped ninety-seven women and men attain employment and 87% of these women and men are still in their job.
