Parish Staff Changes

This summer as of July 1, Michelle Hochrein, our Director of Children's Faith Formation for the last ten years, will retire. Since the beginning of the year, we have advertised the position. Sadly, the applicants were few. In response, I have decided to reassign duties and responsibilities and we have asked parishioners to serve as area coordinators for our faith formation program.

Marinell High and Don Dalgleish will serve as lead administrators, consultants, and mentors. We will have a team of leaders for First Reconciliation and First Communion lead by Jeanette Westermann. Laurie Miller will serve as the on-site coordinator for Children's Faith Formation on Tuesdays and Sundays. Jim Burns will serve as the on-site coordinator for Wednesday evenings. These stipend positions will help us to continue to offer our faith formation sessions. We will also be looking at how to restructure our God Squad and Mustard See Youth Groups.

Maintenance Position

We will be adjusting how we care for our two campuses as we move through the summer months. Details coming soon.

Phase II Construction Status

We continue to work through the concerns raised by Webster Township Planning Commission. We have a meeting on June 7 to address lighting, parking, and landscaping concerns. In April we received two zoning variances which allow us to add on to our current church and to help build a building that looks unified for years to come. A successful outcome! It is our hope to finalize our last issues and then receive our special use permit from the township board. Then we will seek to begin construction as quickly as possible.

JULY 2023 FOCUS RECIPIENT



The committee has chosen **House by the Side of the Road** for our focus charity for the July 29/30, 2023, collection. The purpose of this charitable organization is to provide clothing and small household items at no charge to children and adults with limited funds for some of life's essential needs. People within Washtenaw County often find themselves in need after family breakup, job loss, house fires or after a prolonged illness within the family. House by the Side of the Road also serves the homeless and those reentering society after prison. People with mental health issues, recent immigrants and migrant workers also use the services of this organization.

House by the Side of the Road was started in 1970 in Washtenaw County as a partnership between the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners and churches in the area. When the county was unable to continue funding, the volunteers began procuring funds to keep the organization going. They are a 501 (c)(3) and are currently located at 2051 S. State Street in Ann Arbor.

When clients enter the building they will find rooms of bedding, books and media, clothing for adults, children and toddlers, household items, shoes and toys. While there are limits to how many items may be taken at once, all items are free without qualification.

Recent statistics show how that the need within our community is increasing. The non-profit states they served 451 households in March, 131 more than in February. They served 757 adults and 720 children in March, averaging 20 households per day.

House by the Side of the Road is 100% operated by volunteers. They currently have 47 regular volunteers and welcome additional support either by volunteering, donating items or cash.

St. Joseph Caritas Committee members selected this organization after thoughtful and prayerful consideration, and we hope that our Parish community will be generous in their donations to this worthwhile community service group.

Together, we've walked through multiple liturgical seasons since I came in October, and I can't thank you enough for the joy you bring me at every Mass and prayer service through the unique sounds and prayers of every season. St. Joseph Parish is indeed a vibrant and loving community, and you bless each other with your incredible compassion and care.

Music in our liturgy, by its very nature, is an act of care and hospitality as we welcome each other into our personal prayer by our shared singing voice. I believe that music filled with much life and real joy has the powerful effect of heightening our level of prayer. We are called to an experience in our worship where our bodies vibrate with the sound of God's people in prayer. My job as Director of Music and Liturgy is one of allowing the Holy Spirit to enter our song that welcomes all people. By blending multiple styles and instrumentation and pulling from vast historical music, music from a previous generation, and music that resonates with our modern ears today, all people present have an opportunity for prayer and praise.

Isn't it indeed a radical act when we gather 25, 50, 250 or 400 people, who breathe together, form the same words, and sing melodies and rhythms and lift up hearts in praise to God? That's incredible! Our music, through one collective voice, is a beautiful opening of our hearts and is not simply intended for entertainment or for passive prayer. Sometimes, you clap exuberantly after being moved by a specific piece of music. While we say thank you, we recognize your applause as an "Amen" and as an expression that together we have met a prayer need and touched your heart, raising our community's level of prayer and praise.

We sing in many styles and they may not be a favorite and the challenge of newness may make it difficult. I know that in this process, we will not please everybody. The songs we raise in praise and prayer teach us to better understand God's love for all of us, each with our own perspective, and lead us to love each other better. We are a vibrant church living in a modern world that needs Jesus's message of hope and looking forward to the joyous Resurrection. We are a people looking ahead.

As always, please feel welcome to find a home in one of our choirs or ensembles. Our music will continue to reflect our unique prayer and community life here at St. Joseph Parish. Our music should heal our sorrows and anxieties, and should share the vitality and the real joy that comes to our heart through the Gospel of Jesus. Alongside receiving the sacraments, hearing God's sacred Word, and offering all of our prayers, we leave each experience to bring this joy to others. We leave, able to best live the Gospel message in the world. We leave as better and more loving people in the world.






Daniel's Courage in Captivity VBS 2023 June 26-30th, 9am-12pm Country Church Campus
