CARITAS

The Caritas Committee would like to thank the parishioners of St Joseph Parish for your generous donations to our October Focus Charity, Guadalupe Workers. Your generosity to our October Focus Charity, Guadalupe Workers, provided life-affirming funds in support of mothers in pregnancy and after. Because of your generosity we were also able to donate to our regular recipients: Dexter Family Services, St Joseph Parish Service Fund, Habitat for Humanity, Catholic Social Services Food Pantry, and St Luke N.E.W. Life Center.

Our December 30/31 Caritas Focus Charity is Delonis Center. In Washtenaw County, 5000 people are experiencing homelessness, among them veterans, domestic violence survivors, and people battling substance abuse. Robert J Delonis Center, located in downtown Ann Arbor, is the primary provider of emergency shelter for 1,200 Washtenaw County homeless individuals each year. Delonis Center programs and services provide for the immediate needs of the homeless by providing food, shelter, transportation, and medical care. During the cold winter months, they offer warmth and survival in their warming centers. Delonis Center provides services for people living on the streets, designed to give them dignity, like showers, access to storage, laundry, and an address to receive mail. The long-term needs of the homeless are addressed through case management and community referrals for housing, work, substance abuse treatment, and money management.

Delonis Center has used two vans to transport clients to appointments, deliver supplies to key locations, and pick up homeless clients to bring to warming centers in the winter months. However, they recently lost use of one of the vans and urgently needs a second van. Delonis Center has asked for assistance to be able to provide transportation to the homeless this winter. As we celebrate the gift of our Lord, Jesus, and gather with family and friends in our safe homes, with food on the table and a warm bed to sleep, please consider a generous contribution to support those people who have none of these blessings.

If you have suggestions for local organizations that the Caritas Committee should consider supporting in the future, please share your ideas with us by sending a recommendation to the parish office with your name and contact information and the reasons the organization should be considered.

SCOUT BSA TROOP 456 ACTIVITIES



This month Troop 456 participated in the **Ann Arbor Trout Unlimited's** annual trout survey. They waded through Mill Creek pulling a barge with a generator that powered an electrical system that would temporarily stun the fish, so that we could catch them. The scouts would then weigh and measure the length of the trout before releasing them back into the creek. It was a little brisk in the morning, however, with the right gear, it was definitely comfortable, unless you fell in the water, like one of the Scouts! Another great time with Troop 456. Troop 456 worked with Troop 3456 to help the fall cleanup

around the country church. The results achieved were commendable. After the cleanup activity, both troops participated in the Scout Jamboree on the Air (JOTA). JOTA uses amateur radio to link Scouts and hams around the world, around the nation, and in your own community. This jamboree requires no travel, other than to a nearby amateur radio operators setup. Scouts of any age can participate, from Cub Scouts to Boy Scouts and Venture Scouts.. Once at the ham radio station, the communication typically involves talking on a microphone and listening on the station speakers. However,


many forms of specialized communication may also be taking place, such as video communication, digital communication (much like sending a message on your smartphone but transmitted by radio), or communication through a satellite relay or an earth-based relay (called a repeater). The exchanges include such information as name, location (called QTH in ham speak), Scout rank, age, and hobbies.
