Dear Parishioners of St. Joseph Parish,

Enclosed is the annual report of the financial status of St. Joseph Parish for the fiscal year 2023-2024. It shares where your generous gifts and sacrifices have been used for the following:

- † Faith formation and education programs for adults, youth, and children.
- † The celebration of the sacraments and the liturgical spiritual activities of our faith.
- ⁺ For the care and maintenance of our two campuses, this includes 2 churches, parish office, 2 houses, parish center, pavilion, festival barn, 4 maintenance barns, and festival building.
- ⁺ The salaries and benefits of the 13 employees who work for our parish helping us to live, grow, and to practice our Catholic faith.

Our Construction Status

Our construction project continues to work toward a mid-January completion date. This could be earlier or later. It is too early for a specific date, but it will be done for our Blessing and Dedication on March 15, 2025.

Kitchen & Technology Shower & Silent Auction

Our Kitchen and Technology Shower was an outstanding success. We raised enough to outfit our new kitchen completely. We are thankful for all who contributed.

Our Silent Auction funds from last year were added into the Kitchen & Technology Shower funds.

Plant Sale Funds

We have made a point to save our plant sale monies for the last several years. These monies will pay for the landscaping around the new building. We will have a planting day this fall.

Festival Funds

This year's Festival raised \$39,543.54. This was \$8,902 less than last year. Funds will be used for the new phones, and IT equipment needed in the new offices and classrooms. This year a generous donor returned the grand prize as a gift and we are grateful. We will continue our practice of tithing \$4,000 to four different local charities.

Significant Repairs

The Village Campus had boiler repairs, and a water heater replaced totaling \$5,100. At the Country Campus we had septic tank issues of \$7,557 covered by insurance. We had parking lot repairs of \$16,350. The boiler needed to be replaced costing nearly \$40,000 and lawn mower and tractor repairs and service cost \$4,331.

New Director of Faith Formation

This year we welcome Katie Webber as our new leader of Children's Faith Formation. She was raised in Troy and her husband Felix is from China. We welcome them to our parish and support Katie as she leads our children in faith formation.

New Sunday Goal

Our new Sunday goal moved from \$23,300 per week to \$25,000 per week. A significant increase and I am grateful for your generous response 17 weeks into the fiscal year.

As we look with excitement to the completion of our new building, we are grateful for all the sacrifices of time, talent, and treasure toward the good works and ministries of St. Joseph Parish.

In Appreciation

I thank all parishioners who faithfully make financial gifts of sacrifice for the work of our faith here at St. Joseph Parish. Last year we had to increase our goal twice and your generous giving helped us stay in the black.

Pastoral Council Notes



Summary recent Town Hall Meetings:

The Move to Mast Transition Committee, supported by your Parish Council, held Town Hall meetings on September 15th and 18th to communicate the status of the recent and future campus efforts.

Construction Status – You've noticed the progress on the exterior of our Country Church campus. There is similar progress on the interior of the building, with drywall, duct work, and

electrical all being well over 70% complete. Our goal is for construction to be finished by year end, allowing the staff to occupy the new space in early January. We are currently within our budget for the project. There is still a lot of work to be done and a lot of variables to deal with in a construction project of this size, so these estimates may be adjusted slightly. We are persevering in our efforts, so please be patient. We hope to announce a firmer completion and moving timeline to you in November.

We also need to implement our landscape plan to add beauty around the new building and along the paths leading to it. Fall is an excellent time to plant trees and shrubs, so please watch the bulletins for a call for volunteers to help with this effort. Proceeds from our plant sales (~\$38000) will be used, but that money goes a lot further with volunteers doing as much of the planting as feasible.

Moving Plan – The Transition Team and Parish Staff have done an incredible job of identifying which of the articles in the current Parish Office and Center needed to be moved to the new building, discarded or sold at the Flea Market. The team has also solicited bids for professional cost-effective transport of the heavy, large, bulky and hard-to-move articles to the new facility. These items will be placed in the new facility by the movers, based on the floor plan of the new spaces and staff guidance. The cost for this well coordinated 2-3 day moving effort will be paid for using funds from the Festival and Flea Market.

We will need your help in packing some of the smaller items, especially dinner ware, silverware, glasses and smaller kitchen items from the Parish Center, as well as some smaller items from the Disciple House, into our new facility. Please watch the bulletin for those opportunities to serve your Parish.

Village Campus Dream and Vision – The direction for dealing with the current Parish Office (built as a convent in 1951), Parish Center (built as a school in 1925) and Rectory (built in 1904) was reviewed. Earlier this year the options of 1) selling two or all three of the buildings, 2) continuing to own and use the Center and/or Rectory, or 3) to raze all three buildings and create a Sacred green space were identified. The Parish Council, Finance Council and Transition Committee jointly determined Option 3 best met the needs of the Parish. Total cost for removing the three buildings from the Village Campus, including asbestos abatement, is approximately \$400,000. (The buildings ARE currently safe for use but contain some enclosed asbestos that must be properly dealt with during demolition.)

The first phase of this plan requires renovation, starting late 2025, of the current Disciple House on the Country Church property so it can then serve as the rectory. The costs for this renovation are not yet known and are not included in the Village Campus estimates discussed above. Once this step is complete, removal of the old Parish Office, Parish Center and Rectory buildings can proceed, with a target of having the site cleared and basic landscaping done by Q4 of 2027. The Transition Team also shared a preliminary vision of what the Village Campus could look like, including enhanced parking and the sacred green space for prayer.

We are asking for volunteers to help flesh out the Village Campus Dream and Vision into a plan to be implemented once the current village site is prepared. We need to define specific parking enhancements, configuration of the outside Sacred space, and any enhancements needed for the Village Church to facilitate its continued use and our presence in the community.

Funding – All the effort described above requires prayer, planning and funding. Summing the anticipated costs for removing the current Village Campus Parish Center, Parish Office and old rectory, performing required renovation of the Disciple House to serve as the new rectory, providing enhanced parking, landscaping and creation of the Sacred space at the Village Campus, and contingency for changes needed to the Village Church leaves a need for us to create a \$1,000,000 "Finish the Vision" campaign. Our plan is to combine this effort with the Diocese of Lansing's 'Saints and Scholars' funding initiative and start the combined campaign at St. Joseph in early fall of 2025. We anticipate the combined campaign goal over three years for St. Joseph Parish to be \$2,757,000 (\$919,000/year) comprised of \$1,000,000 'Finish the Vision' and \$1,575,000 DoL Saints & Scholars.

Other News:

2024 Festival – Both the Flea Market and Festival were great successes in our efforts to actively engage St. Joseph parishioners and the surrounding community. Thanks be to God and to all the volunteers and participants that make this event the annual success it is. Please plan to help out and attend next year's events and bring friends!






