Our Focus charity for the December Caritas collection is **Catholic Charities of Washtenaw County (formerly Catholic Social Services).** They are located on Packard Street in Ann Arbor. Their mission statement : **To share the love and presence of Christ in our community through acts of compassion and mercy in a manner that respects the inherent dignity of every person.** 

Over 65 years ago, Catholic Charities of Washtenaw County was established to change the lives of some of the most vulnerable persons in the surrounding communities and neighborhoods. At the start, the organization focused on the needs of pregnant women and families, including the provisions of food. Decades later, these foundational services remain active, alongside several additional programs, all sharing the vision of creating better everyday life for the people we serve.

These programs provide counseling, family and children's services, and senior services. Counseling includes Behavioral Health services, Family Centered services, Domestic Violence Intervention services, Marriage Preparation, Offender Success, Pregnancy Counseling, and Substance Abuse treatment. Family & Children includes Adoption services, Families First, Parenting Support, Food Pantry, Foster care, Nurturing Families, and Washtenaw and Child Advocacy Center. Senior services include Adult Day program, Grandparents as Parents, Neighborhood Senior services, Resource advocacy, Senior Volunteer opportunities and Volunteer caregiver respite opportunities.

The common theme is **SERVICES.** In I Peter 10-11 : As generous distributors of God's manifold grace, put your gifts at the service of one another, each in the measure he has received. The one who speaks is to deliver God's message. The one who serves is to do it with the strength provided by God.

The work of **CCW** is the work of the Catholic Church, which unequivocally denounces racism, discrimination, injustice, and violence in all forms. Inherent in their mission is defending and caring for the oppressed, marginalized, and forgotten within our community, promoting the dignity and value of every individual, and respecting our shared humanity.

#### St. Joseph Respect Life Commission

An important element of valuing life is lifting and supporting women and families who have experienced a pregnancy or infant loss. In the United States, one in four women have experienced miscarriage, and one in 160 pregnancies ends in stillbirth. Sadly, one in four people who attend Mass have experienced the loss of a child, and statistics show that 70% of marriages that face the loss of a child end in divorce. However, only 5% of people will receive the appropriate support for the grief they are challenged with.

However, thanks be to God, there is hope and help! First and foremost, as a parish family, we can wrap our love around families experiencing a loss. This can mean listening, praying, making meals, or helping with a family's other young children. A woman experiencing miscarriage or infant loss can reach out to our parish office, where she will be connected to someone who can come alongside, as well as comprehensive resources to provide additional help. Also, the office has information regarding funeral/interment options, to allow for a dignified burial.


