## Our Mission





## Pastoral Council Notes

### The Light of Advent: Preparing Our Hearts for Christ



As we enter this holy season of Advent, let us open our hearts in prayerful anticipation of the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Advent is a time of hopeful waiting, repentance, and joyful preparation for the coming of our King.

During each Mass of Advent, we begin by lighting one of the four candles on the Advent wreath, reminding us of the virtues of **Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love**. Three of the candles are purple—symbolizing penance, preparation, and sacrifice—while the third candle, lit on the third Sunday, is pink, representing joy.

The **first candle**, known as the *Prophet's Candle*, calls us to remember the promise of the Messiah foretold by Isaiah and the prophets of old. As we light this candle of **Hope**, we are invited to renew our trust in God's faithfulness and to place our confidence in His divine plan. *How can we listen more deeply for God's promises in our lives this week?*

The **second candle**, the *Bethlehem Candle*, reminds us of Mary and Joseph's journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem, where our Savior would be born. This candle represents **Peace**, calling us to quiet our hearts and prepare a place for Christ within us. *Where is God calling us to trust Him more fully on our journey?*

During the **third week of Advent**, we light the pink *Shepherd's Candle*, symbolizing **Joy**. As Christmas draws near, our hearts are filled with joyful anticipation, just as the shepherds rejoiced when they heard the good news of Jesus' birth. *What brings you true joy as you prepare to welcome Christ this Christmas?*

Finally, the **fourth candle**, known as the *Angel's Candle*, represents **Love**. It reminds us of the ultimate love of God, who sent His only Son to live among us and show us the fullness of divine love. As we light this final candle, we rejoice in the message of the angel Gabriel and await the glorious celebration of Christmas. *How can we share God's love with others in this final week before Christ's birth?*

As we light each candle on the Advent wreath, may the growing light remind us that the darkness of the world is overcome by the Light of Christ.

May you and your family experience a blessed Advent and a joyful Christmas season.

#### Special Note for Christmas:





## Troop 456 Activities

The Service project for this period was the Troops' participation at the Dexter Daze event in support of the Dexter Lions Club and the annual Mill Creek fish survey. The major outing for this period was the Tree Runners outing.



We stayed at Proud Lake Recreation Area at the Pines Group site in Oakland County near Wixom for our camping experience. The activity for the campout involved working with Tree Runners Adventure Park to participate in a group team-building activity involving low-ropes and high-ropes courses. Aerial Adventure Courses are a unique outlet for outdoor recreation where groups can come and enjoy obstacle courses of various degrees of difficulty, while being suspended in the tree canopy. Different types of obstacles, such as zip lines, barrels, cargo nets, and bridges, are connected between platforms constructed around trees.

The troop held a planning meeting to identify the activities of the upcoming year. On the right, there is a representation of the outcome of the planning activity. Some of the activities have been reported on in a previous report. The long-term outing that is being planned right now is the Air Force Museum campout. This activity requires a more than normal level of planning and coordination. The initial plan is to camp at the Wright-Patterson Air Force Base wilderness area, which was specifically designed to support Scout Camping. During the planned weekend, a visit to the Air Force Museum will be the principal activity.
